
Jim Dagg delivered a souvenir booklet to Mr Sleeman's office and will later in the year take one to Mr Rodda.

Once living in the colonial territory and then in the country of Canada they often had to accept any kind of work so they could send money home to families left behind. Some even managed to improve and modify the governance of their new country when elected to public office.

Personal information is from the *internet*, from family histories, and articles prepared by our TCA members. Some information had to be edited to fit the format of the booklet. This is only a small sample of many who came to live in Canada, so we hope you will let this booklet, and the lives of these few notable people, encourage you to further search the internet, local libraries and your family histories to find a more complete story.
